# Open Forum - Proposed Property Sale - Jan. 20

We have important decisions to make. One decision presented to the congregation in October was whether to sell the residence we own at 612 Highland Ave, commonly referred to as the "green house." The congregation chose to postpone that vote until the Annual Congregational Meeting, Feb. 10. It will be reconsidered at that time.

The discussion will be led by Pastor Shelor, using an approach outlined in the book, *Getting to Yes: Negotiating Agreement Without Giving In*. The approach attempts to seek "Win-Win" outcomes by focusing on the interests of those involved, rather than on positions or people.
