STAINED GLASS WINDOWS PROJECT The Sanctuary window project will begin gaining steam and you will readily notice "progress". Conrad Studios is contracted to remove the 14 stained glass windows and recondition them at their studio, located in Vero Beach, Florida. Conrad Studios will also insert the reconditioned stained glass back into new frames once the new frames are installed. Thus far, two large side windows have been removed and the stained glass has been already reconditioned. Before they can be reinstalled, the second contractor on the team, Door and Glass Services Co, Tampa, will install special Florida-approved frames, then Low-E impact, clear, exterior protective glass will be installed. On January 7th, more stained glass will be removed: the round window over the choir loft, the 3 small windows in the narthex, as well as an insert in the exterior parlor door. As with all projects, patience is needed, and the finished project will be worth it! The project will be speeding up in speed in January and February.
